Trade to Teach

Frequently asked questions

This document outlines the frequently asked questions (FAQs) for the <u>Trade to Teach Internship</u> <u>Program</u> (T2T Program) and is subject to change at the department's discretion. The T2T Program is available for people who will commence study in 2025.

Eligibility for the T2T Program

- I have already started an Initial Teacher Education (ITE) degree. Am I eligible to apply? You are not eligible for the T2T Program if you have already commenced an ITE degree.
- Can I commence mid-year?

No, we are only accepting applications for those intending to commence their ITE degree/T2T Program at the start of 2025.

- My trade qualification is not in an ITD area. Will I be accepted into the program? No, we are seeking applications from those with a trade qualification (apprenticeship and Trade Certificate III) in an Industrial Technology and Design (ITD) area. For example, fitting and turning/machining, metals engineering, carpentry, joinery, plumbing, electrical or mechanics. Similar ITD trades may be considered.
- Do I have to be an Australian citizen to be eligible?

You must be an Australian citizen or have permanent residency in Australia to be eligible for the T2T Program, and you will be required to provide evidence of this.

Applying for the T2T Program

• How do I apply for the program?

Applications open 26 August 2024. Once open, visit the Teach Queensland website (<u>www.qld.gov.au/tradetoteach</u>) and press the Apply button to be redirected to the SmartJobs Government website to complete your application.





• How do I enrol in the Initial Teacher Education program?

Please apply directly with the university.

• What documents do I need to provide?

- Resume (including names and contact details of 2 referees)
- Maximum 2-page response to selection criteria
- Copy of trade qualification(s)
- Statement of industry service
- Copy of Birth Certificate
- Evidence of Australian Citizenship/Permanent Residency
- Do the documents need to be certified by a JP?

No, however certified copies of relevant documents are preferred.

• Will my referees be contacted?

Yes. At least one, if not both, of your referees will be contacted if you are shortlisted as part of the application process.

Your resume should include two referees who can attest to your performance and conduct in the workplace. Referees should not be family members, and should have a thorough knowledge of your capabilities, work performance, and conduct within the previous two years. It is preferable to include your current/immediate/past supervisor. By providing the names and contact details of your referee/s, you consent for these people to be contacted by the selection panel. If you do not wish for a referee to be contacted, please indicate this on your resume.

Year 1 – Fulltime study

• How do I enrol in the Initial Teacher Education (Secondary) (ITE) course?

When you apply for the T2T Program, you should also apply to enrol in the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) at one of our T2T Program partner universities:

You must choose to specialise in Industrial Technology and Design at CQU, or Design and Technology at UniSQ.

Please contact the university directly to understand their entry requirements and enrolment process. We recommend also speaking with them about recognition of prior learning (RPL) based on your trade qualification and industry experience, and a possible trade-entry pathway.

If you are successful with your T2T Program application, you will receive a conditional offer into the T2T Program, pending evidence of your enrolment with a partner university.

• How will I know if I will be accepted into the ITE course?

An offer of placement will be sent to you from one of the partner universities. Please contact the partner university with enquiries.

• How do I choose a university?

You must enrol at one of the T2T Program partner universities of your choice. While some universities offer some programs and courses online, they may still have a practical and face-to-face component/s. Universities also differ in their course structure and offerings.

- Do I need to complete the ITE course on campus or can I complete the ITE course online? The department does not have a preference regarding how you complete your ITE course, as long as all requirements of the course are met, and you graduate in a maximum of four years.
- If I am accepted into the ITE course, what teaching areas can/should I enrol in? You must enrol in the Industrial Technology and Design teaching area at CQU, or the Design and Technology teaching area at UniSQ, as part of the undergraduate ITE course. The T2T Program targets people who are eligible to teach in the high demand area of Technologies (ITD).

• Who will pay for my course fees?

You will be responsible for payment of any course fees (including tuition).

• Do I have to enrol full-time?

Yes, the T2T Program is only accepting full-time applications with the intention to graduate by the end of 2028. Please note that RPL may reduce the duration of your degree or study load. This needs to be discussed with the university and agreed with by the T2T Program Team.

• I have a condition which requires support. How will this be provided?

It is recommended that at the time you apply for enrolment into the undergraduate ITE course, you contact your university to ask what student supports are in place. Please also advise the T2T Program Team of your support needs at the time of application.

• I have previously commenced an ITE course but couldn't complete it due to circumstances. Am I eligible to apply?

You are eligible to apply for the T2T Program if you have not commenced an ITE course recently. If there has been a significant break in time since you ceased your study, your situation will be considered.

- I have a trade qualification from a non-English speaking country. Can I apply?
 Yes, however you may be required to complete an International English Language Testing
 System (IELTS) test or complete an English Bridging Course to be eligible for enrolment.
- What if I do not meet the minimum entry requirements for the university as my trade qualification is not suitable?

If you are not eligible for enrolment due to your trade qualification not being suitable, a bridging course at university may bring your qualification up to a sufficient standard to be accepted into the university. Please consult with the relevant university early to confirm requirements.

• If I have not studied for a long time, what can I do to prepare?

The partner universities offer free courses to prepare you for tertiary study. It is recommended that you complete these. You should complete these preparation courses in the year prior to commencing study (2024). The T2T Program partner universities offer the following:

- UniSQ <u>Tertiary Preparation Pathway</u> (TPP)
- CQU Skills for Tertiary Education Preparatory Studies (STEPS)
- What if my trade qualification is not recognised by the university to give me RPL?

You can still apply to the university to commence the ITE course, however you will be required to meet minimum entry requirements and complete the full requirements of the ITE undergraduate degree. Please contact the university for more information.

• Do I complete a Teaching Performance Assessment (TPA) in the final year of my ITE program?

Yes, you are required to complete all ITE program requirements including a TPA. Please see your university for further information on graduation requirements.

• Do I have to successfully complete Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE)?

Yes, you are required to complete all ITE program requirements including LANTITE. Please see your university for further information on graduation requirements.

• What are the dates of the ITE course offerings?

Please refer to the partner university websites for information.



Yes, you will need to complete PEx as per the requirements of your enrolled ITE program.

- Where will I be placed for my PEx during my first year of study? Placements for PEx in your first year of study will be arranged by the university.
- Am I eligible for any other financial support to help me with this? The PEx in your first year of study will be unpaid.
- Can I continue to work in my first year of study? There is no restriction on working in the first year, however the ITE course is full-time and may require up to 40 hours a week to complete the coursework successfully.
- Is there a way to directly connect with our study colleagues?

Universities will set up communication channels and activities for T2T participants to connect with each other and with the key university contacts. The department will also hold drop-in sessions and communities of practice, where you can connect with each other and the T2T Program Team.

Year 1 - Scholarship

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• What can I spend the \$20,000 on? Do I need to keep receipts?

The \$20,000 (taxed) scholarship payment is provided to reduce the financial impacts of undertaking a career change. There are no requirements on how you spend the funds, and you do not need to keep receipts for departmental purposes.

• Is the program payment (scholarship) taxed?

Yes, the payment is taxed in accordance with Australian Taxation Office tax rates. It will be paid in four instalments across 2025. All payments are taxed and may affect your annual income and/or benefits received and will impact the take home pay in the fortnight in which it is paid (this includes additional contributions to tax e.g. HECS/HELP). It is recommended that recipients obtain financial advice from a financial advisor, <u>Services Australia</u> and/or the <u>Australian Taxation Office</u> for any implications this may have on current and future earnings/taxable income/ benefits received.

• How will I receive the program payment?

Payments will be made in four instalments (March, June, August, November) and will be paid directly to your nominated bank account.



Year 2, 3 and 4 - Internship

• Where will I be placed during the internship?

Your internship placement will be determined based on the needs of the department at the time, however personal circumstances and preferences will be considered.

• Will I be required to move? If yes, is teacher accommodation available? Can my family come with me? Will it be the same school in which I will complete my minimum service period when I graduate my ITE program?

If you are required to relocate, your family will be able to relocate with you. Teacher accommodation cannot be guaranteed. Accommodation can be discussed with your Regional Human Resources team once a position has been determined. Your preference to stay in the same school for your entire internship and your minimum service period will be considered once you graduate from your ITE course, however this cannot be guaranteed.

• What will the expectations and workload be?

You will commence employment as an intern "teaching" at a 0.5FTE or 50% teaching load (25 hours a fortnight) from the second year of your ITE course. University programs are designed to be flexible, which will allow interns to complete their study while also working in their internship positions with the department.

• How will the teaching load during internship be structured across the academic year?

The 0.5FTE or 50% teaching load will be for the duration of each academic year during the internship, for a maximum of three years from 2026. The department will work with universities and schools in determining the flexibility of the 0.5FTE workload arrangement. Interns will have an opportunity to provide input into this, as they may have a preference as to how they manage their internship and coursework.

• What subjects will I teach on my internship?

During your internship you will teach 0.5FTE or 50% teaching load in the Technologies (Industrial Technology and Design) subject area. The specific subjects that you teach will be dependent on the subject offerings of your host school, and also the subjects you are approved to teach on your Permission to Teach (PTT). Your PTT is approved by the Queensland College of Teachers (QCT).

• Will I have a criminal history check?

Yes. A *Queensland Working with Children Check* (Blue card) will be completed prior to the commencement of your first school-based Professional Experience Placement (PEx) and a more rigorous criminal history check will occur as part of the PTT application process with QCT.

• What is a Permission to Teach?

A <u>Permission to Teach</u> (PTT) process enables a person who is not registered to teach, to be approved by the Queensland College of Teachers (QCT) to teach in a school under strict limitations.

An approved PTT enables T2T Program interns to teach a 50% load in a school as part of their T2T internship under T2T Program guidelines, while completing their undergraduate teaching degree.

Only approved teachers may undertake the duties of a teacher in a state or non-state school in Queensland. Approved teachers include registered teachers and persons approved to teach under Permission to teach (PTT).

• What subjects are considered ITD for the purposes of the T2T Program?

The following subjects are suitable to teach as part of the T2T Program internship:

- Design and Technologies (Material and Technologies Specialisations) for Years 7-10 (ACARA curriculum)
- Design and Technologies (Engineering Principles and Systems) for Years 7-10 (ACARA curriculum)
- Building and Construction Skills for Years 10-12 (QCAA applied curriculum)
- Engineering Skills for Years 10-12 (QCAA applied curriculum)
- Furnishing Skills for Years 10-12 (QCAA applied curriculum)
- Industrial Graphics Skills for Years 10-12 (QCAA applied curriculum)
- Industrial Technology Skills for Years 10-12 (QCAA applied curriculum)
- Can I teach VET on my internship?

No. You can only teach the subjects approved on your PTT, and the QCT will not approve Vocational Education and Training (VET) subjects as part of a PTT.

• If I study two teaching areas as part of my undergraduate teaching degree, how do I get experience in my second non-ITD teaching area?

You must only teach ITD subjects as part of your paid internship. You will get experience in your second teaching area as part of your professional experience placements (PEx), which are organised by your university.

Internship salary

• What will I be paid during the internship?

Interns will be paid at Band 1, Step 1 of the <u>Teachers' Salary Schedule</u> (\$2,842 per fortnight before tax and other deductions) for the first year of the internship, and any applicable allowances. This amount is as of 1 July 2024 and is subject to change in line with annual enterprise bargaining increases.

<u>Please note</u>: Amounts provided above are Gross amounts (before tax) and do not include fortnightly deductions such as tax and compulsory superannuation. Other deductions could include HECS-HELP.

• Will I receive the same conditions as a state school teacher? i.e. accrual of leave Yes. As an intern you will be employed on a temporary contract and you will accrue leave entitlements (sick leave, long service leave) and will be entitled to payment across vacation periods during your internship.

Year 5 – Permanent offer of employment (post program completion)

• Where will I teach when I graduate from my ITE program?

Positions will be determined based on the needs of the department however, personal circumstances and preferences will be considered.

• Do I have a say in where I teach?

You can nominate your preferred location, and the department will consider your request. Positions will be determined based on the needs of the department however, personal circumstances and preferences will be considered.

• Where are the priority locations?

Priority locations are state schools located in areas other than Brisbane City Council, Gold Coast City Council, Noosa Shire City Council, and Sunshine Coast City Council.

Is there a requirement to work full-time upon completion of the internship?

At the completion of the internship, T2T Program participants are required to complete a minimum period of service with the department, however it is not specified that it is required to be at full-time.

• What happens if I complete the internship and realise teaching is not for me? Do I have to repay the funds?

You may be required to repay the full amount of the scholarship funds and any additional costs (e.g. relocation costs) paid by the department. The department will assess circumstances on a case-by-case basis, exercising discretion for applicants who are unable to complete the full T2T Program minimum service commitment due to compassionate or extenuating circumstances.

Minimum Service Period

• Is there a minimum service period (bonding) to the Department of Education?

Yes, if you are placed in a school that has a transfer rating (TR) of TR1-6, you will be required to teach for the department for a minimum service period of 4 years. If you are placed in a school with a transfer rating of TR7, the minimum service period is 3 years.

• When does my T2T Program minimum service period commitment start?

The T2T Program minimum service period commences from when you start your permanent employment in a Queensland state school, following successful completion of the T2T Program requirements (graduation from the ITE degree) and when you are provisionally registered with the Queensland College of Teachers.

• Is bonding to the department or to a school?

The minimum service period, upon successful completion of the T2T Program, requires T2T teachers to remain teaching with the department, not a particular school. If you cannot remain in the school in which you are placed, the department will support the teacher to find a suitable transfer. This would not be a breach of the minimum service period.

• What happens if I don't meet the T2T Program minimum service period commitment? Do I have to repay the funds?

If you are unable to complete the full T2T Program minimum service period, you may be required to repay part, or all, of the scholarship funds. The department will assess this on a case-by-case basis, exercising discretion for applicants who are unable to complete the full T2T Program minimum service commitment due to compassionate or extenuating circumstances.

• What are transfer ratings?

Each school is assigned a transfer rating from 1–7, which is determined by:



- remoteness basis of distance from Brisbane and/or either distance from Toowoomba or coastal centres with a population of over 8,000
- access to and the level of community services calculated by the distance from, and size
 of designated service centres
- complexity of the school environment
- organisational staffing requirements.

Transfer ratings are used by the department as the basis for determining:

- accrual of individual transfer points which are used to determine the priority order of teacher transfer requests; and
- eligibility for incentives and benefits offered to teachers under the Recognition of Rural and Remote Service Scheme and arrangements relating to departmental accommodation and rental subsidies.
- When I have finished the internship and am required to work for 4 years do I get to choose from a selection of places, or do I have to go where the department asks me?
 Upon successful completion of the T2T Program, graduation from the undergraduate teaching degree, and granting of provisional registration with the Queensland College of Teachers (QCT), you will be offered permanent employment with the department in a Queensland state school (teaching secondary).

The department's vacancy data and knowledge from local HR teams will be used to identify the school in which you will be offered a place. As with the internship placement, the department will check with interns their preferred location and personal circumstances to help inform a suitable permanent placement.

Working with the department

• What are the benefits of teaching in a rural or remote location?

There are many benefits to teaching in a priority location:

- A chance to immerse yourself and become a valued member of the community
- Subsidised housing is available in many rural and remote locations
- Access to Education Futures Institute (EFI) Regional Offices
- Financial allowances may be available:
 - Locality Allowance
 - Recognition of Rural and Remote Service (RoRRS) Scheme.

• How do I find out about what it's like to work for the department?

The department will invite a range of speakers to attend the community of practice events to share their experiences of working with the department, across a range of topics. The department's <u>Working With Us</u> page, includes up-to-date information about teaching in Queensland state schools, salary and benefits, induction, inclusion and diversity, and professional development.

Withdrawal from the T2T Program

• If there are circumstances where I must withdraw and terminate my contract, how do I communicate that? What is the consequence for the termination such as paying the funds back?

If you are unable to continue with the T2T Program and need to terminate the contract, you should email the Trade to Teach Team on <u>tradetoteach@qed.qld.gov.au</u> as early as possible. There will be a conversation between you and the T2T Program Team (and the university where relevant) to understand the situation and your circumstances preventing you from completing the T2T Program.

You may be required to repay the scholarship money, or part thereof. This will be based on individual circumstances. The T2T Program Team will consider extenuating circumstances.

If I am unable to continue in the T2T Program and have worked as a T2T intern in a school, there will be a requirement to pay back the salary paid?
 During the internship, you are paid a salary for teaching a 50% load, so this will not be requested to be repaid.
